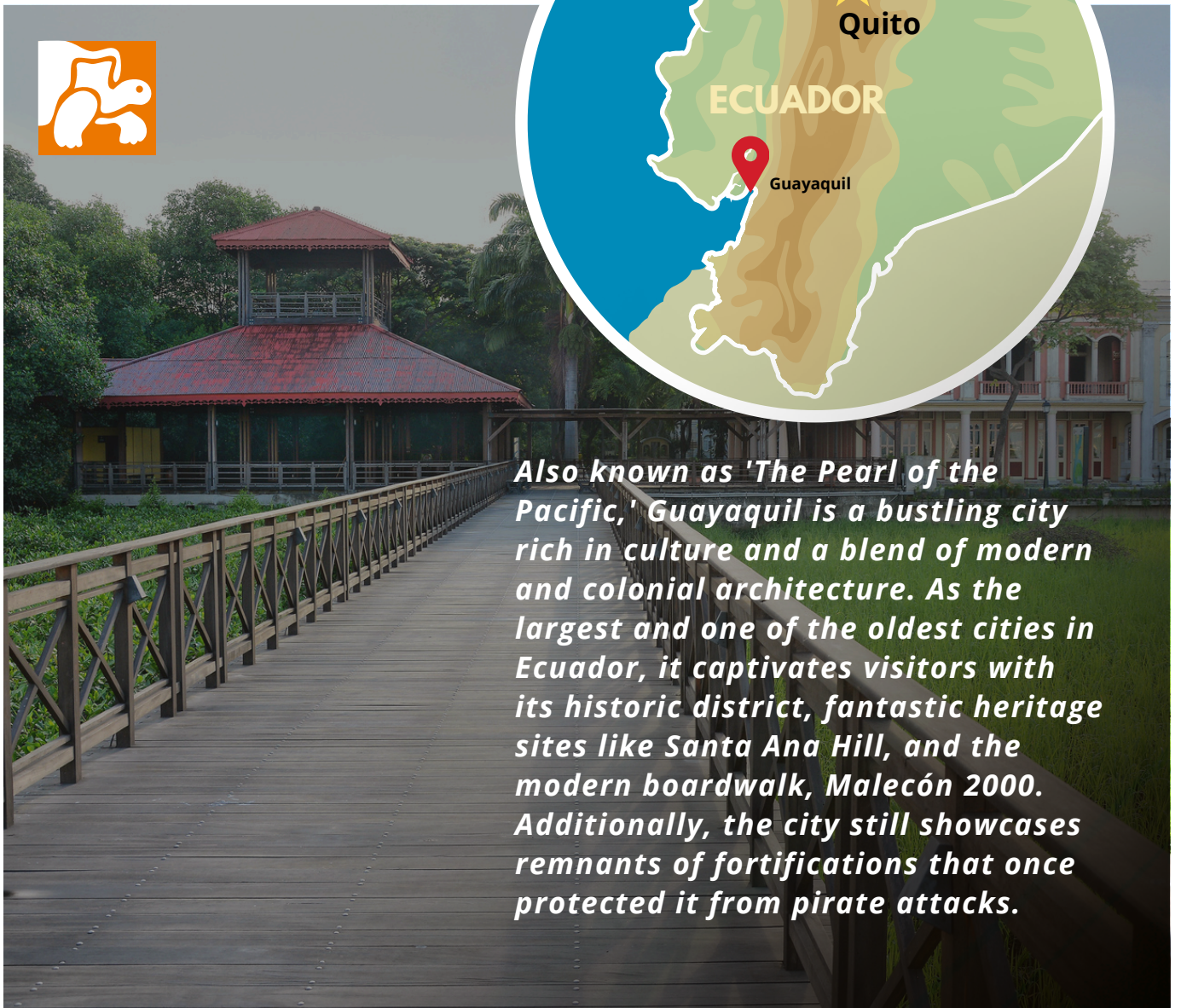


JOURNEY THROUGH GUAYAQUIL WONDERS

Full Day Tour in Guayaquil



Also known as 'The Pearl of the Pacific,' Guayaquil is a bustling city rich in culture and a blend of modern and colonial architecture. As the largest and one of the oldest cities in Ecuador, it captivates visitors with its historic district, fantastic heritage sites like Santa Ana Hill, and the modern boardwalk, Malecón 2000. Additionally, the city still showcases remnants of fortifications that once protected it from pirate attacks.

Today's adventure will take you on a wonderful trip back in time and through the best of Guayaquil's present!



After a hotel pick-up, embark on a journey through Avenida 9 de Octubre, the city's largest avenue, where you can admire many important buildings and plazas. The first stop of the tour will take you to the city's Cathedral and Parque Seminario, informally known as 'Iguana's Park' due to the countless local iguanas lounging around. Take a moment to relax and observe the daily life of Guayaquileños amidst the bustling port, the Guayas river, and the local architecture.

Continue the tour to explore the Municipal Hall and visit a local artisan market in the Malecon 2000, situated along the Guayas River. Admire the Civic Plaza, the Moorish Tower, and the famous Rotonda Monument, which commemorates an important meeting between two of Latin America independence leaders.



Later on, continue by car towards the colorful and historic neighborhood of Las Peñas, an emblematic site declared as Cultural Heritage due to its charming architectural style. Located at the foot of Santa Ana Hill, the oldest street in the city, Numa Pompilio Llona, will transport you back to colonial times as you wander through narrow cobblestone passages and vibrant houses.



Parque Historico welcomes you to the second part of your adventure. This beautiful spot is a testament to Guayaquil's heritage. Here, you can marvel at the gorgeous covered walkways of centenary buildings relocated here to showcase the profound sense of pride of Guayaquileños in their history and traditions and also enjoy nature while strolling through local trees-shaded paths.

The park also features the opportunity to see local wildlife in open areas, such as monkeys, deer, tapirs, tropical birds, crabs and many more. Next, you will discover ancient farming traditions and artifacts from the colonial era. After this fantastic journey, you will be transported back to your hotel for drop-off. End of services.
